The theme for the conference is Teaching the Role of Information Assurance in Critical Infrastructure Protection. Relevant topics include, but are not limited to the following:

- Computer Security and Infrastructure Protection
- Education of Citizens in Information Security
- Information Security Education in Schools

- Education of Information Security Professionals
- Teaching Information Systems Auditing
- International Standards of Security Education

Both papers and panel topics will be considered.

Authors are requested to submit original work, not previously published, limited to 12 pages (using 11-point font, single column format, and reasonable margins on 8.5"x11" or A4 paper). Each paper must have an abstract and a list of keywords. Papers must be written and presented in English. All submissions will be reviewed double blind and should be submitted in a form suitable for anonymous review. Each submission should be in the form of two documents: (1) a cover page listing the title, authors and contact information, and (2) the blinded paper with the title and no author information.

Panel proposals of no more than 4 pages are welcome. These should include a statement of the panel topic, the name of the moderator, and a list of potential panellists with a brief description of their qualifications.

In order to explore new ideas in security education, the conference will include two workshop sessions approximately 90 minutes in duration.
